### **Agency Highlights**

BBBSMMC served **720** children through 1-to-1 mentoring! This includes **400** children served through our **7** School Based Programs and **4** Beyond School Walls Programs.

40 Kids Club events were held with nearly 700 participants! They included tickets donated to 16 sporting events, concerts, and shows that were enjoyed by Bigs and Littles. Over 70 families were provided with holiday gifts, meals, and other services through Adopt-A-Family and other donations.

In addition to being the beneficiary of several community events, BBBSMMC hosted 5 special events supported by over 1,500 attendees.

775 volunteers logged an extraordinary 46,500 hours providing mentoring, organizing events, and serving on our Board of Trustees, and various committees.

**New Colonia Program** 

All 11 of our School and Beyond School Walls programs kicked off successfully including a new program with Colonia High School and Colonia Middle School!

Throughout 2017, our agency provided unique activities for our Littles to attend with their Bigs and children waiting to be matched with their parent or guardian. These activities included recreational and skill building activities such as the annual Fishing trip, a Cooking & Nutrition Class, Personal Finance Seminar, and a Girl Power Workshop. Our agency hosted two Back-to-School parties to provide kids with backpacks and school supplies to start the new school year off prepared. Other offerings were career-focused and

explored Engineering, Accounting, Retail, and Architecture. These activities provide a sense of community for all Littles and are particularly important for children on our waiting list and not yet matched with a mentor.

**99%** of our seniors graduated high school and most were accepted into college. Two of our Hatfield Scholarship recipients graduated from Brookdale Community College in May.
